



Bullying is a form of violence. Bullying may be physical (hitting, kicking, spitting, pushing), verbal (taunting and malicious teasing), or emotional (spreading rumors, extorting, intimidating). Bullying can occur face-to-face or online.

Are You or Someone You Know Being Bullied?

If so, here are some steps you can take:

- Report bullying to a responsible and caring adult such as a teacher, counselor, administrator or any school staff member. Tell your parents.
- Discourage bullying by not joining in the laughter, teasing or gossip.
- Campaign against bullying through school activities.

There are ways you can report bullying and other school related safety issues without giving your name:
